## UMBC Communication Services Resident Quick Start Guide – Fall 2017

### Wireless Network

The wireless network at UMBC is available throughout the residence halls and academic buildings. The network uses the IEEE 802.11n/ac standards to transmit and receive data. Because the addition of privately-owned access points may inadvertently cause interference, **personal (non-UMBC DoIT) installed access points or wireless routers are not permitted unless WiFi is disabled.** For buildings with poor cellular coverage DoIT recommends enabling WiFi calling feature on your cell phone. There are two wireless networks at UMBC.



- “eduroam” (**this is the preferred network**) provides access to campus network services and the Internet. All traffic is encrypted with WPA2, and your credentials may be stored on your device. The eduroam network may be used with laptops as well as smartphones.
- “UMBC Visitor” does not require a myUMBC account and should be used for basic web and email access only. On “UMBC Visitor” bandwidth is limited and peer-to-peer networking is blocked. Popular file sharing programs may not work. Because it does not require authentication, this network may be an appropriate choice for networked gaming consoles and mobile devices that cannot authenticate.

### Cable Television

UMBC offers resident students access to local and premium channels through its cable television network. There is one CATV jack in each residence hall room and apartment common room. In Chesapeake, Susquehanna, Patapsco and Potomac Halls, the jack is located on the underside of the communications box. Use a RG-6 coaxial cable to connect from the room jack to the television (or other type of receiver). Coaxial cabling may be purchased from the Campus Bookstore. Do not staple or kink cabling, as this may damage the cable and reduce signal quality.

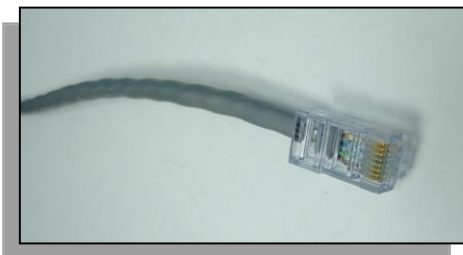


A digital television, or a Clear QAM tuner, is required to receive the channels. For more information, see <http://doit.umbc.edu/services/students/>.

## Residential Network

UMBC provides a 10/100/1000 Mbps network connection to every student living on campus. Access may be easily obtained by plugging in an Ethernet cable from your computer to one of the three ports located on the bottom of our wireless device or the jack provided in each residential room.



Users must use their UMBC credentials to sign into the campus network. For instructions on configuring Windows and OSX please visit <https://resnet.umbc.edu>. For devices that don't support those instructions (gaming consoles and streaming devices) you may register your device manually at <https://register.umbc.edu>. You must register prior to first use, but registration is required only once per semester. For more registration information please visit <https://resnet.umbc.edu>.

Each port is designed to a single network device. If you need to connect more devices than available ports, a router with wireless disabled may be required. Use a Category 5e Ethernet cable or better to connect to the network. Ethernet cables may be purchased from the Campus Bookstore.

## Telephone

Residence halls have been equipped with phones in the hallways, and buildings in the Hillside, Terrace, and West Hill apartment communities have been equipped with phones in each stairwell. Walker Avenue apartment common rooms have also been equipped with a telephone. These phones may be used to make emergency, on-campus, local, and toll-free calls without cost. On-campus calls may be dialed by using the five-digit extension (beginning with 2, 3, or 5). Off-campus local calls and toll-free numbers may be dialed by first dialing 9 to hear a new dial tone, then dialing the number as usual. Residents in campus residence halls and Hillside, Terrace, and West Hill apartment communities may have a phone line installed in their room by contacting the Office of Residential Life.
